



“I was completely healthy. Then 14 months back, the problems started. I have blood and discharge all the time.... I am getting radiotherapy.”

Munni Bi lived in Rajghat colony, less than a kilometre from the plant, at the time of the leak, and suffered cervical cancer. Studies conducted after the gas leak indicated increased cervical and breast cancers among gas-affected women. Munni’s health got worse in the last two years and she finally died of advanced cervical cancer at her own residence in 2004, at the age of 46.
