In this regard, I would respectfully remind you of Article 9 of the UN Declaration of Human Rights which states that 'No one shall be subjected to arbitrary arrest, detention or exile.
INADEQUATE MEDICAL TREATMENT
I write this letter to you as a physician, to ensure that Professor
